I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "MARING" has made landfall over Mauban Quezon and is now traversing Laguna-Manila area.

Moderate to heavy rains will be experienced over Bicol Region, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Metro Manila, Central Luzon, Pangasinan due to TD "MARING". Residents of these areas are alerted against possible landsides and flashfloods.

Sea travel is risky over the Eastern seaboards of Aurora, Quezon, and Bicol region.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal **elsewhere** is now lifted.

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged, Twigs of small trees may be broken, Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage. 	

The public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Advisory No. 07 for Tropical Depression "MARING" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants

The public and DRRM Councils concerned are advised to continuously monitor the updates which will be incorporated in the 24-hour public weather forecast
