I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression “MARING” has maintained its strength and is now over Rizal-Metro Manila area.

Moderate to heavy rains will be experienced over Metro Manila, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA and Pangasinan due to TD “MARING”. Residents of these areas are alerted against possible landslides and flashfloods.

Sea travel is risky over the **seaboards of Mindoro** and the eastern seaboards of Aurora, Quezon, and Bicol region.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal over **Camarines Sur** is now lifted.

Location of eye/center		At 1:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression “MARING” was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Tanay, Rizal (14.6°N, 121.3°E) .

The public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Advisory No. **08** for **Tropical Depression “MARING”** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants
- The public and DRRM Councils concerned are advised to continuously monitor the updates which will be incorporated in the 24-hour public weather forecast
