I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "MARING" has traversed the Zambales mountain range and is now over the coast of Zambales.

Moderate to occasionally heavy rains is expected over Zambales and Bataan while light to moderate with occasionally heavy rains during thunderstorms will be experienced over Tarlac, Pampanga and Bulacan. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible landside and flashfloods.

Sea travel remains risky over the seaboards of Central Luzon, CALABARZON and Mindoro due to TD "Maring".

TD "Maring" is expected to exit PAR tomorrow evening or Thursday early morning.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals elsewhere are now lifted.

Location of eye/center	At 7:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "MARING" was estimated based on all available data at 10 km West Southwest of Iba, Zambales (15.3°N, 119.9°E).

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged, Twigs of small trees may be broken, Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.

The public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Advisory No. 10 for Tropical Depression "MARING" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants
- The public and DRRM Councils concerned are advised to continuously monitor the updates which will be incorporated in the 24-hour public weather forecast
