11 September 2017

At 4:00 PM, the Typhoon, with International Name TALIM, located East of Northern Luzon has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "LANNIE". It has the maximum sustained winds of up to 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 145 kph. "LANNIE" has no direct effect to the country.

Meanwhile, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Southern Luzon has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was given the local name "MARING". It has the maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 60 kph. "MARING" is forecasted to move West Northwest at 13 kph.

Due to "MARING", Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was raised to Metro Manila, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Northern Quezon including Polillo Island, Rizal, Bulacan, Pampanga, Aurora, Quirino, Nueva Ecija, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, and Pangasinan.

At 11:00 PM, TS "MARING" was estimated at 190 km East of Infanta, Quezon.

12 September 2017

At 5:00 AM, the TS "MARING" has slightly intensified as it continued to move towards

TCWS No. 01 was raised over the Metro Manila, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Nothern Quezon incl. Polillo Island, Rizal, Bulacan, Pampanga, Quirino, Nueva Ecija, Nueva Vizcaya, Benguet, La Union, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, Pangasinan, Laguna, Quirino, and Aurora

At 5:00 PM, TS "MARING" was located within the vicinity of Pampanga and about to leave the landmass of Luzon.

II. EFFECTS

A. PRE-EMPTIVE POPULATION (TAB A)

1. A total of 1,783 families or 8,915 persons were pre-emptively evacuated in Regions III, CALABARZON, and NCR.

B. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

1. A total of 9,432 families or 40,966 persons were affected in 292 barangays in Regions III, NCR, and CALABARZON. Of which, a total of 534 families / 2,173 persons are still being served inside and outside evacuation centers:

397 families / 1561 persons

1. A total of twenty-two (22) persons were reported dead in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and NCR. Meanwhile, four (4) persons went missing in the Laguna and Catanduanes.
