I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

11 September 2017

At 4:00 PM, the Typhoon, with International Name TALIM, located East of Northern Luzon has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "LANNIE". It has the maximum sustained winds of up to 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 145 kph. "LANNIE" has no direct effect to the country.

Meanwhile, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Southern Luzon has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was given the local name "MARING". It has the maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 60 kph. "MARING" is forecasted to move West Northwest at 13 kph.

Due to "MARING", Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was raised to Metro Manila, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Northern Quezon including Polillo Island, Rizal, Bulacan, Pampanga, Aurora, Quirino, Nueva Ecija, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, and Pangasinan.

At 11:00 PM TS "MARING" was estimated at 190 km East of Infanta, Quezon.

12 September 2017

At 5:00 AM, the TS "MARING" has slightly intensified as it continued to move towards Quezon-Aurora area.

TCWS No. 01 was raised over the Metro Manila, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Northern Quezon incl. Polillo Island, Rizal, Bulacan, Pampanga, Quirino, Nueva Ecija, Nueva Vizcaya, Benguet, La Union, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan, Pangasinan, Laguna, Quirino, and Aurora

At 5:00 PM, TS "MARING" was located within the vicinity of Pampanga and about to leave the landmass of Luzon.

At 11:00 PM, "MARING" has intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it moved towards the West Philippine Sea.

13 September 2017

At 5:00 AM, "MARING" has maintained its strength while traversing the West Philippine Sea.

At 4:00 PM, TS "MARING" exited the PAR. All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals are now lifted.

II. EFFECTS

A. PRE-EMPTIVE POPULATION (TAB A)

1. A total of **1,783 families or 8,915 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in Regions III, CALABARZON, and NCR.

B. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB B)

1. A total of **9,432 families or 40,966 persons** were affected in **292** barangays in Regions III, NCR, and CALABARZON. Of which, a total of **534 families / 2,173 persons** are still being served inside and outside evacuation centers:

Inside **6** ECs: **137 families / 612 persons**
Outside ECs: **397 families / 1561 persons**

C. CASUALTIES

1. A total of **eight (8) persons were reported dead** due to landslide and collapsed rip-rap. Meanwhile, **five (5) persons went missing** in the Provinces of Rizal and Laguna.

7. William Fami Inalisan	Male	16 y/o	Drowned due to strong water current. He was found by the Philippine Red Cross Rescue Team and Brgy. San Isidro Rescue Unit and was rushed to Ospital ng Parañaque. He was declared DOA by the attending physician.
8. Paterno Moreno Cortez Jr.	Male	57 y/o	At about 11:30AM, 12 September 2017, the victim went swimming in the sea despite the warning given due to big waves. After several minutes, the victim was found floating lifeless in the shallow part of the sea. The victim was rescued and was immediately rushed to San Andres Municipal Hospital but was pronounced DOA.

F. FLOODED AREAS (TAB D)

- a. Rendered duty at the Regional Emergency Operations Center.

PIA CAR

- a. In close coordination and communication with the Office of Civil Defense-Cordillera (OCD-CAR) in gathering important details for information sharing to the public.
- b. Continuously sending and providing warnings to the public thru SMS, Social Media, broadcast Media.

PRO CAR

- a. The Regional Public Safety Battalion (RPSB) with basic search and rescue equipment is on stand-by.

AFP 503rd Infantry Brigade

- a. Prepositioned all assets and on standby.

PDRRMC Apayao

- a. Raised the alert status of Emergency Operations Center to BLUE effective 11:00 AM, 12 September 2017.

PDRRMC Benguet

- a. Raised the alert status of Emergency Operations Center to BLUE effective 8:00 AM, 12 September 2017.
- b. Issued advisory to warn small-scale miners in the Province to stay in safer grounds and suspension of any mining activities until further notice.

CDRRMC Baguio

- a. Raised the alert status of Emergency Operations Center to BLUE effective 11:00 AM, 11 September 2017.

OCD NCR

- a. On Blue Alert Status effective 2:00 PM, 11 September 2017.

DILG NCR

- a. Activated the Monitoring of LGU Preparedness Measures using the Operation Liso Protocol.

- f. Medical Teams from the different DOH Metro Manila Hospitals are on standby and ready to be deployed in case their services are needed.
- g. Public Health Teams (WASH, Health, Nutrition and Psychosocial Teams) are on standby.

DepEd NCR

- a. Identified evacuation centers and four (4) major evacuations: H. Bautista Elementary School, Nangka Elementary School, Malanday Elementary School, and Concepcion Integrated School.

DPWH NCR

- a. Declogging of drainage laterals on identified flood-prone areas.
- b. Continuous potholes patching and road repair.
- c. All district offices is on alert 24/7 maintenance crew ready for deployment as the need arises.

CDRRMC Malabon City

- a. Issued MMDRRMC Advisory No. 1 for TD “TALIM”.
- b. Warning Committee advised to conduct thorough observation/monitoring water marker and river height every hour and report all gathered information to the Chairperson.

CDRRMC Mandaluyong City

- a. Conducted ERP-PDRA Meeting on 11 September 2017.
- b. Streets that may be flooded due to continuous heavy rains were identified and specific responders have been assigned to the areas.

- c. Traffic Enforcement Division is ready to implement rerouting plans if flooding occurs.
- d. City and Barangay responders, Engineering Department, PNP, and BFP are alerted for possible deployment if needed.
- e. Relief packs and other supplies are already on standby.

CDRRMC Marikina City

- a. Continuous monitoring of water level at Marikina River and flooded streets through CCTV camera.
- b. Continuous monitoring of rainfall amount at the Marikina Watershed through Effective Flood Control Operation System (EFCOS).
- c. Rescue assets (equipment and personnel) are prepositioned for possible mobilization.

CDRRMC Muntinlupa City

- a. Activated 24/7 Emergency Operations Center.
- b. Organized Search and Rescue (SAR) Teams and Clearing Operations Teams.

CDRRMC Parañaque City
