#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "ODETTE" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE TOWARDS CAGAYAN-ISABELA AREA.

Location of Eye/Center: (as of 07:00 AM)	655 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan
Coordinates:	17.7°N, 127.9°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move West at 26 kph

## TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL (TCWS)

#1 (30-60 kph expected in 36 hours)	Luzon: Cagayan including Babuyan group of Islands, Isabela, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Hocos Norte and Hocos Sur
	Wave Height: (Open Sea) 1.25-4.0 meters

 Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 350 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.

• TD "ODETTE" may intensify into a Tropical Storm before making landfall over

Cagayan-Isabela area tomorrow early morning.

 Sea travel remains risky over the northern and eastern seaboards of Northern Luzon due to the northeasterly surface windflow enhanced by the approaching Tropical Depression.

### **ACTIONS TAKEN:**

NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Advisory No. 03 for TD
"ODETTE" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded in
the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs
from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

 Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying

areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.

 The public and DRRM Councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at 11AM 12 October 2017
