**I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

"PAOLO" has slightly intensified as it continues to move over the Philippine Sea.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 450 km diameter of the Severe Tropical Storm.
- "PAOLO" may intensify into a Typhoon in the next 24 to 36 hours.
- The outer rainbands of "PAOLO" may bring scattered light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains over Bicol Region, Visayas and Mindanao.
- Meanwhile, at 10:00PM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 200km West Northwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (10.9°N, 117.1°E). This weather system will bring scattered light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains over Palawan.
- Moderate to rough seas expected over the eastern seaboard of Southern Luzon, of Visayas and of Mindanao.

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "PAOLO" was estimated based on all available data at 675 km East Northeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (10.5°N, 132.1°E).
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to 105 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 130 kph.
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move North Northeast at 15 kph
