I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:


"PAOLO" has maintained its strength and continues to move in a North Northwest direction.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 450 km diameter of the typhoon.
- The outer rainbands of "PAOLO" will bring scattered moderate to occasionally heavy rains over Bicol region, Eastern Visayas and CARAGA becoming light to moderate rains over the rest of Southern Luzon, of Visayas and of Mindanao. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Meanwhile, at 10:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 280km West of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (9.7°N, 116.2°E). This weather system will bring scattered light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains over Palawan.
- Sea travel is risky over the eastern seaboard of Visayas and of Mindanao.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "PAOLO" was located based on all available data at 735 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.8 °N, 132.4 °E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 145 kph.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move North Northwest at 20 kph
