I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "PAOLO" maintains its north northeast direction and is now slowly moving away from the country.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the **1600 km** diameter of the Typhoon.
- The outer rainbands of "PAOLO" and the southwesterly windflow enhanced by this Typhoon will bring scattered to widespread rains and thunderstorms over Visayas and the regions of MIMAROPA and Bicol. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides due to moderate to occasionally heavy rains. Meanwhile, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) near Mindoro has already dissipated.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of Northern Luzon, the eastern seaboard of Central Luzon, the seaboard of Southern Luzon and Visayas, and western, northern and eastern seaboard of Mindanao.
- "PAOLO" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) by Sunday morning (22 October).

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "PAOLO" was located based on all available data at 870 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.3°N, 130.3°E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 145 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 180 kph.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move North Northeast at 17 kph
