I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "PAOLO" has intensified as it continues to accelerate away from the country.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the **1900 km** diameter of the Typhoon.
- "PAOLO" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) **between late night today and early morning tomorrow.**
- **The southwesterly wind flow enhanced by this Typhoon will bring cloudy skies with scattered light to moderate and at times heavy rainshowers during thunderstorms over Western Visayas, Central Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, ARMM, Northern Mindanao, Caraga, and the provinces of Palawan and Mindoro.**
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of Northern Luzon, the eastern seaboard of Central Luzon, Southern Luzon and **Mindanao, the southern and eastern seaboard of Palawan and the western and eastern seaboard of Visayas.**

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "PAOLO" was located based on all available data at 1,000 km East of Basco, Batanes (21.6°N, 131.5°E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 180 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 220 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move North Northeast at 22 kph
