SUBJECT : Severe Weather Bulletin No. 03 re Severe Tropical Storm "PAOLO" (I.N. "LAN")

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:


"PAOLO" has intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm as it continues to move over the Philippine Sea.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 450 km diameter of the Severe Tropical Storm.
- The outer rainbands of "PAOLO" may bring scattered light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains over Bicol region, Visayas and Mindanao.
- Severe Tropical Storm "PAOLO" may intensify into a Typhoon in the next 24 to 36 hours.
- Meanwhile, at 10:00AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 395km West of Coron, Palawan (12.0°N, 11.5°E). This weather system will bring scattered light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains over Palawan.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "PAOLO" was estimated based on all available data at 765 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.0°N, 132.7°E).
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 90 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move North Northwest at 7 km/h
Forecast Positions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 hour (<i>Tomorrow morning</i>): 760 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar (12.7°N, 132.2°E). • 48 hour (<i>Thursday morning</i>): 1,075 km East of Baler, Aurora (15.7°N, 131.6°E). • 72 hour (<i>Friday morning</i>): 980 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (18.8°N, 130.9°E). • 96 hour (<i>Saturday morning</i>): 1,035 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (22°N, 131.8°E). • 120 hour (<i>Sunday morning</i>): 1,375 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (26.5°N, 133.7°E).
