**I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

**Typhoon "PAOLO" has maintained its strength and is about to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).**

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 1900 km diameter of the Typhoon.
- "PAOLO" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) **early morning tomorrow.**
- The southwesterly wind flow enhanced by this Typhoon will bring cloudy skies with scattered light to moderate and at times heavy rainshowers during thunderstorms over **Western Visayas, Mindanao, and Palawan.**
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of Northern **and Southern Luzon**, the eastern seaboard of Central Luzon and **of Mindanao, and western and eastern seaboard of Visayas.**

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At <b>10:00 PM</b> today, the eye of Typhoon "PAOLO" was located based on all available data at <b>1,190 km East Northeast</b> of Basco, Batanes ( <b>24.2°N, 132.8°E</b> )
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>185 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>225 kph.</b>
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move <b>North Northeast</b> at <b>27 kph</b>
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<b>24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 1,785 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (31.2°N, 135.2°E)</b>
<b>Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal</b>	<b>No Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal</b>

**ACTIONS TAKEN:**

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Advisory No. **12** for **Typhoon "PAOLO" (I.N. "LAN")** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded in the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

- The public and DRRM Councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be incorporated in the 4AM Public Weather Forecast and in the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at **11:00 AM today**.
