I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "PAOLO" is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the **1900 km** diameter of the Typhoon.
- Cloudy skies with scattered light to moderate and at times heavy rainshowers due to thunderstorms over **Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas and Palawan**.
- Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of Northern **Luzon**, the eastern seaboard of Central **and Southern Luzon** and of **Visayas**.
