





I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

1. Since 15 October 2017, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) caused cloudy skies with light to moderate to occasionally heavy rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. As a result, series of flooding incidents transpired in some provinces in Regions IX and ARMM.

Region IX

Zamboanga City

- A total of eighteen (18) barangays were affected by flashflood brought about by heavy rainfall due to ITCZ.

Zamboanga del Norte

- On 16 October 2017, flooding incidents occurred in the Municipalities of Siocon and Liloy due to overflowed rivers (Mucas River in Liloy, and Siocon and Pisay Rivers in Siocon).

ARMM

Maguindanao

- Water level in Simuay River has gradually increased due to continuous rain which caused flooding to low-lying barangays in Sultan Mastura, Maguindanao.

Sulu

- Houses were reported damaged in the municipalities of Tapul, Jolo, Kalingalan Caluang, and Pata, all in the province of Sulu due to strong winds and big waves brought about by ITCZ.

II. EFFECTS:

A. Affected Population

1. A total of **4,710 families / 23,520 persons** were affected in **twenty-nine (29)** barangays in Zamboanga City and **Zamboanga del Norte**:

2. OTHER DAMAGES

Zamboanga City

- Some facilities in Limpapa National High School and Sea wall in Brgy. Patalon incurred damages due to flashflood
- Crops and fishponds in Brgy. Vitali incurred damages due to the flashflood
- Two (2) *Palakaya* (Small fishing vessel) were reported damaged due to big waves in Jolo Wharf
- One (1) pump boat were partially damaged in Brgy. Pandami due to big waves
- Slope protection in Zamboanga City incurred damages due to ITCZ

Zamboanga del Norte

- Damages to crops, infrastructure, fishing industry, and properties were reported in the municipality of Siocon due to heavy rainfall

III. ACTIONS TAKEN:

A. REGION IX

OCD IX

- Continuously monitoring the situation and in close coordination with Zamboanga DRRMO and DSWD IX for updates
- RDRRMC IX member-agencies are on standby and ready
- Conducted ocular inspection in Brgys. Labuan and Vitali
- *Attended the emergency meeting in CDRRMC Zamboanga City*

DSWD IX

- Provided Family Food Packs to the affected families and in close coordination with the concerned Field Office for updates on the status of the affected families and possible assistances needed
- *Conducted assessment within the AOR*
- *Continuously coordinates with municipalities affected in Zamboanga del Norte on the status of displaced families*

DOH IX

- Distributed 200 jerry cans and 5 tents in Brgy. Labuan.
- Medicines are available and ready for distribution once requested
- *Continuously monitors the situation*

COAST GUARD WESTERN COMMAND

- *Implemented No Sail Policy within the AOR*

MGB

- *Sent inventory of areas prone to flood and landslide*

E-Media

- Distributed food packs, water and used clothing to the affected families in Brgy. Labuan

Regional Disaster Management Center in Pagadian City and Regional Satellite Office in Zamboanga City

- Manned for 24/7 monitoring, reporting, and dissemination of advisories and updates

LGU Zamboanga City

- Distributed food packs and activated the community kitchen in the affected barangays

CDRRMC Zamboanga City

- Distributed hot meals in Brgys Vitali and Mangusu
- Distributed slippers in Brgy. Labuan
- *Called for an emergency meeting to discuss the possible declaration of state of calamity within the City*

BDRRMC Labuan

- Distributed non-food items, relief goods, water, and food packs to the evacuees in Labuan Central School

BDRRMC Talisayan

- Provided food and non-food items to the evacuees in Talisayan National High School

B. REGION ARMM**OCD ARMM**

- Coordinated with PDRRMC Sulu and with LDRRMO Jolo, Tapul and Pata re the strong wind incident
 - Coordinated with PSWDO Sulu re number of affected families/persons
 - Coordinated with MDRRMC Sultan Mastura re flooding incident
 - LDRRMCs affected conducted assessment and validation of the extent of damages
 - Continuously monitoring the situation
