I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "RAMIL" HAS CROSSED THE CALAMIAN GROUP OF ISLANDS AND IS NOW MOVING TOWARDS THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

- **Moderate to occasionally heavy rains are still expected over Mindoro provinces, Palawan, Batangas, Northern Quezon including Polillo Island and Aurora. Residents in these areas alerted against possible landslides and flashfloods. Meanwhile, light to moderate with possible occasional heavy rains during thunderstorms will still prevail over Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon**
- **Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) #1 over Southern Occidental Mindoro has been lifted.**
- Sea travel remains risky over the areas with TCWS #1, as well as the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon due to the Tropical Depression and the surge of the Northeast Monsoon.
- "RAMIL" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow evening or Friday early morning.

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "RAMIL" was estimated based on all available data at 145 km West of Coron, Palawan (12.0 °N, 118.9 °E)
Strength	Maximum winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph
