I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

09 November 2017

At 7:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Catarman, Northern Samar has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "SALOME". The center of TD "SALOME" was estimated at the vicinity of Mondragon, Northern Samar.

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 is raised over Camarines Sur, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate including Ticao and Burias Islands, Romblon, Marinduque, Southern Quezon, Laguna, Cavite, Batangas, Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Leyte including Biliran. Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 200 km diameter of the Depression.

At 11:00 AM, TD "SALOME" has slightly intensified as it crosses Ticao Pass. Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 250 km diameter of the Tropical Depression. TCWS No. 1 is raised over Metro Manila, Rizal, Bataan, Camarines Norte, Catanduanes and Quezon.

At 8:00 PM, "SALOME" maintained its strength and is now in the vicinity of Batangas. It is expected to be closer in Metro Manila at around 8:00 PM to 12:00 PM, tonight (09 November 2017) which will bring moderate to heavy rains with occasional gusty winds.

II. EFFECTS

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Continuously disseminating Severe Weather Bulletins to RDRRMCs/OCDROs concerned through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- b. Issued NDRRMC Memorandum No. 137, s. 2017 dated 09 November 2017, directing RDRRMCs III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and NCR to raise alert status to BLUE in preparation for the potential effects of TD "SALOME".
- c. Provided PAGASA updates on TD "SALOME" and DENR-MGB List of susceptible barangays to flooding and rain-induced landslides to OCDROs.

2. Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA)

- a. Continuous dissemination of Severe Weather Bulletins, General Advisories, Flood Bulletins and Gale Warnings re TD "SALOME".
- b. Provided updates on Tropical Depression "SALOME".

3. DENR-Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)

a. Provided the list of barangays susceptible to flooding and rain-induced landslides on 09 November 2017.

B. Regional / Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)

 Continuously disseminates weather advisories/ bulletins to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD InfoBoard Text Blast System, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty.

1. REGION MIMAROPA

Office of Civil Defense (OCD) MIMAROPA

- a. Continuous dissemination of Weather Advisories and General Flood Advisories to RDRRMCs, PDRRMCs, CDRRMCs, LGUs, Local Radio Station and line member agencies through SMS, info board, facsimile and uploaded the same to OCD-RDRRMC MIMAROPA Facebook and Skype accounts to ensure widest dissemination of these advisories.
- b. Placed Operations Center in Alert Status re LPA for coordination/monitoring and assistance.
- c. Continuous coordination with response agencies and monitoring of weather situation in Area of Responsibility (AOR).
- d. Coordinated with RDRRMC member agencies re: Preparedness Measures for LPA.
- e. Coordinated with Coast Guard Stations and Substations within the area re: status of port operations.

Department of Science and Technology (DOST) MIMAROPA

- a. Provides update to LGUs and uploaded updates on Facebook page Thru DOST Provincial Science and Technology Center (PSTC).
- Placed Automatic Rain Gauges and Water Level Monitoring Station in MIMAROPA as source of data thru "Project NOAH" and "PREDICT" website.

Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) MIMAROPA

- a. Sent advisory to all provincial offices re LPA.
- Informed all DRR-CCA Provincial Focal persons to coordinate with DILG Regional Office re preparedness measures of provinces and possible effect of LPA.

Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) MIMAROPA

- a. Activated all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in 5 (five) provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations in their areas.
- b. Activated all members of R/P/C/M QRTs together with special projects on a 24/7 basis for any untoward incident due to the said weather disturbance.
- c. Advised P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities in their respective areas of Responsibility (AOR).
- d. In close coordination with OCD for any warning signal/updates for monitoring purposes and response mechanism for areas that will be affected.
- e. With available stockpile of 23,995 Family Food Packs (FFPs) to all SWADT and Regional Warehouses including prepositioned goods in identified GIDA/critical areas.

Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) MIMAROPA

a. Constant coordination with LGUs NGOs and other government agencies to support the operational activities.

- b. Linkages/coordination with Police Forces, Barangay Officials, Tanods and Citizen Crime Watch to provide security to the evacuation centers.
- c. Alerted all BFP personnel for any disaster related response.
- d. All trucks and response asset are readily available in case needed.

Coast Guard District (CGD) Southern Tagalog and Palawan

- a. Advised all CG stations and substations to ensure strict implementation of Guidelines on the movement of vessels during heavy weather (HPCG Memo Circular 01-09) and in the absence of weather bulletin in the locality (HPCG Memo Circular 03-01).
- b. Placed Deployable Response Groups (DRGs) on standby status 24/7.
- c. Placed assets on standby status ready for deployment on flood prone and coastal areas.
- d. In close coordination with LGUs, and other government agencies.
- e. Ensure the operational status of HF and VHF radio communications in support to the province' operational concern in case of power blackout.

Department of Health (DOH) MIMAROPA

- a. Prepositioned water disinfectant and collapsible Jerry Cans in flood prone areas of MIMAROPA and PDOHO.
- b. Advised Quad-Cluster Teams (Health, NIE, MHPSS, WASH) to be on standby for deployment and augmentation of services.
- c. Advised Human Resource Management for Health to be available on their catchment areas to augment health services and establish health assistance desk once evacuation starts.
- d. Continuous coordination with PDOHO, DOH retained hospitals, and other regional agencies for the preparations for TD "SALOME".
- e. Advised PDOHO to coordinate with HEMS-PHO for the health emergencies monitored.
- f. Advised PDOHO to coordinate with Ports Authority and advised nearby port health facilities to be on stand-by for possible health assistance in relation to the surge of passengers with medical assistance needed.
- g. Advised PDOHO to coordinate with Philippine National Police, Provincial and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices and other response groups in relation to the preparedness and response activities in relation to the event/s being monitored.
- h. Coordinated with PDOHOs and DOH Retained Hospital in relation to the inventory of all available drugs, medicines and medical supplies including vaccines and transportation assets.
- i. Coordinated with Philippine Air force 505 Search and Rescue for the utilization of Air Medical Services in the Provinces of MIMAROPA as contingency for Air Medevac.
- j. Advised PAMAS Air Ambulance Services through the Provincial DOH Palawan for possible utilization of air evacuation.
- k. Coordinated with RESU MIMAROPA and advised to send ESR updates and notifiable diseases.
- I. Coordinated with Health Promotion Unit MIMAROPA to disseminate and establish health information kiosk to areas of gathering.
- m. Advised PDOHO to render duty at the PDRRMO Operation Center ensure seamless and effective multi agency coordination for the potential effects brought by LPA in their respective catchment areas.

- n. Prepositioned Drugs, medicines, medical supplies and vehicles amounting to ₱13,975,927.28.
- o. Prepositioned water disinfectants and collapsible jerry cans amounting to ₱1,536,880.00.

Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) MIMAROPA

- a. Alerted all maintenance crew of the District Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Teams to monitor condition of National Roads and Bridges and other infrastructures facilities.
- b. Placed all equipment on standby for easier mobilization when needed

Police Regional Office (PRO) MIMAROPA

- a. Ensures the availability of search and rescue assets and personnel.
- b. Alerted all Police Provincial Office down to their lower units and continuous monitoring of situation in their respective AORs.
- c. Coordinated with PAGASA, PDRRMC and other agencies.
- d. Directed all lower units to undertake precautionary measures and other disaster preparedness activities such as the following:
 - Strengthen resilience of emergency communications
 - Ensure readiness of the SRR equipment and supplies to operational requirements (e.g. rubber boat, utility rope, floating multi-tool items, 30L of GOL for generator, flashlights with extra communications equipment, first aid kit, MRE, etc.)
 - Forward deployment and pre-positioning of Search and Rescue (SAR) assets
 - Coordination with Local DRRMC
 - Activation of Disaster Incident Management Task Groups (DIMTG) as the situation may require

a. Issued Executive Order No. 115 mandating the suspension of classes in all elementary schools, both public and private in the province of Oriental Mindoro
