I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Philippines is hosting the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) 2017 with the theme "Partnering for Change, Engaging the World" pursuant to Chapter X, Article 31 of the ASEAN Charter coinciding with the Association's 50th Founding Anniversary. The Philippines is one of the founding members of ASEAN and a signatory to the ASEAN Charter which entered into force on 15 December 2008.

The ASEAN is committed to intensifying community building through enhanced regional cooperation and integration, in particular by establishing an ASEAN Community comprising of ASEAN Security Community, the ASEAN Economic Community, and the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community, as provided for in the Bali Declaration of ASEAN Concord II.

In relation with the Philippines assuming Chairmanship of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) 2017 and the 50th Founding Anniversary of ASEAN on 13-15 November 2017, the Office of the President (OP) issued Administrative Order No. 48, s. 2016 on 04 February 2016 "CREATING THE NATIONAL ORGANIZING COUNCIL FOR THE PHILIPPINES' HOSTING OF THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN NATIONS (ASEAN) IN 2017, AND PRESCRIBING ITS AUTHORITY AND FUNCTIONS".

The Joint Task Group Emergency Preparedness and Response (JTGEPR) of the NDRRMC through the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), under the Committee on Security, Peace and Order, and Emergency Preparedness and Response (CSPOEPR), is established to oversee the over-all emergency preparedness. response, and consequence management for all natural and human-induced disasters that may occur during the Philippine hosting of the event.

On 02 November 2017, the members of the Joint Task Group Emergency Preparedness and Response (JTGEPR) and the Area Command Team (ACT) established an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and Incident Command Post (ICP) at the Heritage Hotel, Roxas Blvd., Pasay City.

b. 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast (as of 4:00 AM, 14 November 2017)

Northeast Monsoon affecting Extreme Northern Luzon.

Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains due to Northeast Monsoon will be experienced over Batanes and Babuyan Group of Islands. No significant impact.

Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms will be experienced over Metro Manila and the rest of the country. Possible isolated floodings or landslides due to heavy rains.

Moderate to occasionally strong winds with northeast direction will prevail over Extreme Northern Luzon and coastal waters will be moderate to occasionally rough. While light to moderate winds from northeast to east will prevail over the rest of the country and coastal waters will be slight to moderate.
