I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"URDUJA" HAS WEAKENED INTO A TROPICAL DEPRESSION AND IS NOW OVER THE SAMAR SEA.

- **Scattered to at times widespread rains** will continue over Southern Quezon, Batangas, Mindoro Provinces, Marinduque, Romblon, and Northern Palawan including Cuyo and Calamian Group of Islands. Residents of these areas must undertake appropriate measures against flooding and landslides and coordinate with their local disaster risk reduction and management offices. Meanwhile, rains over Bicol Region and Visayas is forecast to gradually weaken.
- **All areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 2 have been downgraded to TCWS No. 1.**
- **Sea travel is not advised** over the seaboard of areas under TCWS.
- Meanwhile, at **7:00 AM today, the Tropical Depression outside the PAR** was estimated based on all available data at **1,990 km East of Mindanao (5.0°N, 144.0°E)** with maximum sustained winds of **40 km/h near the center** and gustiness of up to 50 km/h.

Location of eye/center	At 7:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 50 km Southwest of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.2 °N, 124.3°E)
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 60 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move West at 15 kph .


PUBLIC WARNING
