I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

12 December 2017

At 5:00 PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (inside the Philippine Area of Responsibility) developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "URDUJA". It has a maximum sustained winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph as it moves in a North Northwest direction at 6 kph.

At 10:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "URDUJA" was estimated at 415 km East Northeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur.

13 December 2017

At 11:00 AM, TD "URDUJA" maintained its strength as it continued to move in a North Northwest direction.

"URDUJA" slightly changed its course as it continues to move close to Sorsogon-Northern Samar area around 5:00 PM. Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 was raised over the Province of Eastern Samar.

At 11:00 PM, TCWS No. 1 was also issued in the Provinces of Northern Samar and Samar.

14 December 2017

At 4:00 AM, the center of TD "URDUJA" was estimated at 175 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar. It has a maximum sustained winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph as it moves in a westward at 8 kph.

At 8:00 AM, TCWS No. 1 is issued over the Provinces of Catanduanes, Camarines Sur, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Northern Cebu, Capiz, Aklan, and Northern Iloilo.

At 2:00 PM, "URDUJA" has intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it continues to towards Samar Provinces. TCWS No. 2 was raised in Eastern Samar, Samar and

Biliran. TCWS No. 1 is still in effect in Catanduanes, Camarines Sur, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Northern Samar, Leyte, and Southern Leyte, Northern Cebu including Bantayan Island, Capiz, Aklan, and Northern Iloilo.

At 8:00 PM, TS "URDUJA" remains almost stationary and continues to bring damage over Eastern Visayas. TCWS No. 2 was also raised in Northern Samar. In addition, Burias and Ticao Islands in Masbate and Dinagat Islands were included in those areas under TCWS No. 1.

15 December 2017

TS "URDUJA" has slightly intensified as it continues to move slowly off the eastern coast Samar Island. At 4:00 AM, the center of TS "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 205 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar. It has maximum sustained winds of up to 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph. It is forecasted to move Northwest at 5 kph.

At 8:00 AM, TS "URDUJA" remains stationary off the coast of Eastern Samar. At 2:00 PM, TS "URDUJA" remained quasi-stationary and was expected to bring more rains in Eastern Visayas.

At 11:00 PM, TS "URDUJA" still brought heavy rains over Eastern Visayas as it remains almost stationary.

16 December 2017

At 2:00 AM, TS "URDUJA" remained slow-moving off the coast of Eastern Samar while maintaining its maximum sustained winds of 75 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph.

At 5:00 AM, "URDUJA" has slightly intensified and began to move closer towards Samar Island with maximum sustained winds of 80 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 95 kph. It is forecasted to move West Northwest at 10 kph.

At 1:30 PM, **TS "URDUJA" made landfall over San Policarpio, Eastern Samar.** TCWS No. 2 is raised over Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Aklan, Capiz, and Northern Iloilo. Meanwhile, TCWS No. 1 is raised over the Provinces of Marinduque, Southern Quezon, Mindoro, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Cuyo Islands, Calamian Group of Islands, Antique, Rest of Iloilo, Guimaras, Negros Occidental, Northern Negros Oriental, Cebu, Northern Bohol, and Southern Leyte.

17 December 2017

At 2:00 AM, TS "URDUJA" remained almost stationary over the Northern portion of Samar Province. At 4:00 AM, Tropical Depression outside PAR was estimated at 2,040 km East of Mindanao with maximum sustained winds of 40 kph and gustiness of up to 50 kph.

At 8:00 AM, "URDUJA" weakened into a Tropical Depression and is now over the Samar Sea. TCWS No. 2 has been lifted. Meanwhile, TCWS No. 1 is raised over Southern part of Occidental Mindoro, southern part of Oriental Mindoro, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate including Burias and Ticao Islands, northern part of Palawan including Cuyo and Calamian Group of Islands, Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, northern portion of Negros Occidental, northern portion of Cebu, Northern Samar, Samar, Eastern Samar, Leyte, and Biliran.

At 10:00 AM, "URDUJA" made its second landfall to Mobo, Masbate. Meanwhile, the Tropical Depression outside PAR was estimated based on all available data at 1,900 km East of Mindanao.

At 12:00 NN, "URDUJA" made landfall for the third time in Sibuyan Island. At 1:00 PM, the center of TD "URDUJA" was estimated based on all available data at 65 km East Southeast of Romblon, Romblon.

At 5:00 PM, TD "URDUJA" slightly change its course and was located heading towards Aklan. At 6:00 PM, TD "URDUJA" made landfall in Malay, Aklan, its fourth overall.

18 December 2017

At 2:00 AM, TD "URDUJA" has passed in the vicinity of Cuyo islands and was forecasted to move towards Palawan. Sea travel is not advised over the seaboard of Palawan.

At 8:00 AM, TD "URDUJA" has made its fifth landfall over Taytay, Palawan. Maximum winds of up to 5 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph. It is forecast to move West at 18 kph. TD "URDUJA" is expected to exit PAR between tomorrow morning and afternoon. Meanwhile, the Tropical Depression outside PAR has weakened into Low Pressure Area and was estimated based on all available data at 1,630 km East of Mindanao.

At 11:00 AM, "URDUJA" has further weakened after crossing Palawan with maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness up to 60 kph. It was forecasted to move west at 18 kph.

At 11:00 PM, "URDUJA" continued to move west-southwest over the West Philippine Sea. Rains due to "URDUJA" over Palawan is expected to gradually weaken. However, TCWS No. 01 is still hoisted over Palawan. But TCWS raised elsewhere was already lifted.

19 December 2017

At 4:00 AM, TD "URDUJA" has maintained its strength as it approached the western boundary of the Philippine Area of Responsibility. TCWS No. 01 over Palawan has been lifted.

At 11:00 AM, "URDUJA" is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility. All TCWS are now lifted.

II. EFFECTS

A. Pre-Emptive Evacuation (TAB A)

1. A total of **4,327 families were pre-emptively evacuated** in Samar, Northern Samar, and Eastern Samar (Region VIII).

B. Affected Population (TAB B)

1. A total of **281,902 families / 1,090,725 persons are affected** in **1,706 barangays** in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA.
2. Of which, a total of **55,029 families / 224,908 persons** are currently being served inside and outside evacuation centers (ECs):

Inside 235 ECs:	11,715 families / 53,497 persons
Outside ECs:	43,314 families / 171,411 persons

C. Casualties (TAB C)

1. A total of **sixty-four (64) persons were injured** in the Provinces of Samar, Leyte, and **Biliran** (Region VIII) while **two (2) are missing** in San Fernando, Romblon (MIMAROPA).

D. Incidents Monitored (TAB D)

1. A total of **thirty-four (34) incidents** were reported in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, and VIII:

E. Flooded Areas (TAB E)

1. A total of **328 areas** in Regions **MIMAROPA**, VI, and VIII were reported flooded. Of which, flood waters in **40 areas in Region VI have already subsided**.

1. A total of **fifty (50) cities/municipalities** in the Regions **CALABARZON**, MIMAROPA, V, VII, VIII, and CARAGA experienced power interruption/outage.

Water Supply

1. A total of **three (3) municipalities in Region VIII** were affected by water shortage caused by TS "URDUJA". The municipalities are Giporlos and Balangiga in Eastern Samar, and Lope de Vega in Northern Samar.

Roads and Bridges (TAB F)

1. A total of **eleven (11) road sections and seven (7) bridges** in Regions MIMAROPA, V and VIII are not passable.

Sea Ports

1. As of **12:00 NN, 19 December 2017**, there are no reported stranded passengers, vessels, motorbancas, and rolling cargoes in all ports nationwide in relation to "URDUJA".

Airports (TAB G)

1. Since **13 December 2017**, a total of **129 domestic flights** and **4 international flights were cancelled** due to bad weather.

G. Suspension of Classes (TAB H)

1. Classes in **289 cities/municipalities** in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA were suspended on 12-19 December 2017. Of which, 115 cities/municipalities in Region MIMAROPA, V, and VI resumed their classes.
2. Province-wide suspension of classes in all levels and work in government offices was declared in Samar Province (Region VIII) thru the issuance of Executive Order No. 25, s. 2017.

1. On 16 December 2017, the City of Ormoc was declared under state of calamity through Resolution No. 2017-285.

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS (TAB I)

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. The NDRRMOC raised its Blue Alert status effective 13 December 2017, 5:00 PM, to monitor the situation and maintain close coordination with concerned, Regional DRRMCs, NDRRMOC Member-Agencies and offices.
- b. Issued NDRRMOC Memo No. 152 raising the alert status from BLUE to RED ALERT effective 8:00 AM, 15 December 2017.
- c. Continuous monitoring and dissemination of weather advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warning, General Flood Advisories (GFAs) to all RDRRMOCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMOCs).
- d. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Core Group Meeting for the Low Pressure Area East of Hinatuan (TD "URDUJA") on 13 December 2017, 11:00 AM.
- e. Disseminated the following Emergency Alert and Warning Messages (EAWM):
 - 14 December 2017, 7:45 AM – For Region VIII due to the issuance of Orange Rainfall Warning to the Province of Eastern Samar
 - 15 December 2017, 1:19 PM – For the Provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Southern Leyte, and Leyte due to rainfall advisory

- 16 December 2017, 9:27 AM – For the Provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, and Leyte due to the possibility of Storm Surge
- 16 December 2017, 10:32 AM – For the Provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Southern Leyte, and Leyte due to rainfall advisory
- 16 December 2017, 2:47 PM – regarding URDUJA's landfall in San Policarpo, Eastern Samar
- 17 December 2017, 11:24 AM – regarding URDUJA's landfall in Masbate
- 17 December 2017, 5:48 PM – regarding URDUJA's track
- 18 December 2017, 3:38 AM – regarding URDUJA's possible landfall in Northern Palawan

B. Regional/Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs)

- RDRRMC/OCDROs CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA are continuously disseminating weather advisories/ bulletins to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD InfoBoard Text Blast System, and upload the same to social accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty.
- RDRRMCs/OCDROs CALABARZON, V, and VII conducted PDRA Meeting with their respective member-agencies.

IV. DISASTER RESPONSE (TAB J)

- Activated the Response Cluster effective 5:00 PM, 15 December 2017 to further monitor and maintain close coordination among the clusters and its members regarding the situation.
- Conducted Response Cluster Meeting on 15 December 2017, 7:00 PM and was presided by DSWD OIC, Usec. Emmanuel Leyco.

A. Cost of Assistance (TAB K)

1. A total of **₱41,181,423.80 worth of assistance** was provided by DSWD and LGUs to the affected families in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA.

- d. DSWD FO V provided 1,050 family food packs to stranded families. It also provided hot meals to other stranded passengers amounting to ₱319,565.00.
- e. Processed 4,200 family food packs in Daanbantayan.
- f. PPA CARAGA provided meals to all passengers stranded in Lipata sea port.
- g. Distributed 200 pieces of malong to stranded passengers in Odiongan, Romblon and additional 200 pieces to Dangay Port, Roxas, Oriental Mindoro.
- h. Social Welfare and Development Team (SWADT) Romblon provided one (1) box of corned beef and three (3) boxes of 3-in-1 coffee.
- i. DSWD FO VII distributed family food packs worth **₱3,398,400.00** for the affected families in Daanbantayan, Medellin, **Madridejos, Pilar, Bantayan, and for the strandeers in Dumaguete City.**
