### SITUATION OVERVIEW:

#### "VINTA" HAS SLIGHTLY ACCELERATED WHILE MAINTAINING ITS WESTWARD MOVEMENT TOWARD EASTERN MINDANAO.

- **Scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains** is expected over Central Visayas, Eastern Visayas, Caraga and Davao Region and Northern Mindanao within 24 hours. Residents of these areas must undertake appropriate actions against possible flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- **Sea travel is risky** over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS).
- **Expected to make landfall over Caraga - Davao Region area** between late this evening and tomorrow morning (22 December).

<b>Location of eye/center</b>	At <b>1:00 PM</b> today, the center of Tropical Storm "VINTA" was estimated based on all available data <b>260 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.4°N, 128.7°E)</b> .
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>65 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>80 kph</b> .
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move <b>West at 21 kph</b> .
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 320 KM East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.8°N, 125.7°E)</b></li><li>• <b>48 Hour (Saturday morning): In the vicinity of Bayugan City, Agusan del Sur (8.7°N, 125.7°E)</b></li><li>• <b>72 Hour (Sunday morning): 220 km West Southwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (9.3°N, 116.8°E)</b></li><li>• <b>96 Hour (Monday morning): 740 km West of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) (9.9°N, 112.0°E)</b></li></ul>

Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken.</li> <li>• Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken.</li> <li>• Rice and corn may be adversely affected.</li> <li>• Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.</li> </ul>

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged.</li> <li>• Twigs of small trees may be broken.</li> <li>• Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.</li> </ul>
