1. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TROPICAL STORM "VINTA" HAS FURTHER WEAKENED AND IS NOW MOVING TOWARD THE MISAMIS OCCIDENTAL – ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE AREA

- Scattered to widespread moderate to **occasionally** heavy rains will prevail over Visayas and Mindanao within 24 hours.
- Residents of these areas must make appropriate actions against flooding and landslides, coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- **Sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS).**
- **Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) elsewhere are now lifted**

Location of eye/center	At 1:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "VINTA" was estimated based on all available data at in the vicinity of Marawi City, Lanao del Sur (8.0°N, 124.3 °E)
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of up to 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 110 kph

Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken. • Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken. • Rice and corn may be adversely affected. • Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.
