STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS IS EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

The Northern Seaboard of Northern Luzon, Western Seaboard of Southern Luzon and Eastern Seaboard of Southern Luzon (Batanes, Babuyan Group of Island, Western coast of Northern Palawan, Eastern coast of Quezon including Polillo Island, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 – 63) / (24 – 34)	Rough to Very Rough	2.6 – 4.5

Fishing boats and other small seacraft are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels are alerted against big waves.

The next update will be issued at 5:00 PM today.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
