<b>THE SEABOARDS OF NORTHERN and CENTRAL LUZON</b> (Batanes, Calayan, Babuyan, Cagayan, Isabela, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan and Aurora)	Cloudy skies with light rains	(45 –80)/ (24 - 43)	Rough to high	2.8 – 7.0
<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON</b> (Camarines provinces, Catanduanes, Eastern Coast of Albay, Eastern Coast of Aurora and Eastern Coast of Quezon including Polillo Island)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 –68)/ (24 - 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 5.0
<b>THE WESTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON</b> (Western, Eastern and Southern Coast of Mindoro Provinces, and Northern Palawan)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 – 68) / (24 – 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 5.0
<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF VISAYAS</b> (Samar and Leyte)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 – 68) / (24 – 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 5.0

Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels are alerted against big waves.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
