### STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS IS EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON AND VISAYAS  (Eastern Coast of Quezon Including Polillo Islands, Camarines Provinces, Catanduanes, Eastern Coast of Albay, Eastern Coast of Sorsogon, Northern Samar and Eastern Samar)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and isolated thunderstorms	(45-63) / (24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 4.5
THE NORTHERN LUZON AND EASTERN SEABOARD OF CENTRAL LUZON (Northern Coast of Ilocos Norte, Batanes, Calayan, Babuyan, Cagayan, Isabela, and Aurora)	Cloudy skies with light rains	(45 - 63) / (24 - 34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 4.5

### **ACTION/S TAKEN:**

NDRRMC Advisory on Gale Warning No. 19 was disseminated to OCD Regional Offices I, II, III, V, and VIII via facsimile, SMS, and website for further dissemination to the respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels are alerted against big waves.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
