**STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS IS EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:**

<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF VISAYAS</b> (Northern Samar and Eastern Samar)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45-63) / (24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8-4.5
<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF NORTHERN CENTRAL LUZON</b> (Eastern coast of Cagayan, Isabela, and Aurora)	Cloudy skies with light rains	(45-63) / (24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8-4.5
<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON</b> (Eastern Coast of Quezon Including Polilio Island, Camarines Provinces, Catanduanes, Eastern Coast of Albay, and Eastern Coast of Sorsogon)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains	(45-63) / (24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 4.5
<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF MINDANAO</b> (Dinagat Islands, and the eastern coast of Surigao Provinces including Siargao)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms	(45-63) / (24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 – 4.5

Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels are alerted against big waves.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
