I. OVERVIEW / CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

The Feast of the Black Nazarene is celebrated every 9th day of January wherein millions of devotees all over the country observe and join the celebration. Traditionally, the Image of the Black Nazarene is paraded from Quirino Grandstand to Minor Basilica of the Black Nazarene (Quiapo Church).

On 08 January 2018, the traditional "Pahalik" of the Black Nazarene commenced at the Quirino Grandstand. An estimated 320,000 devotees were attended the mass officiated by Manila Archbishop Luis Antonio Cardinal Tagle and Monsignor Hernando Coronel.

At around 3:00 AM 10 January 2018, the ANDAS is inside the Quiapo Church and an estimated of 850,000 devotees attended the procession while 1,250,000 are on the Quiapo Church.

The Command Center in the Minor Basilica of the Black Nazarene (MBBN) or Quiapo Parish Church Command Center along with the Joint Operations Center (JOC) situated along the Manila City Hall has been activated from 06 – 10 January 2018.

OCD-NCR is on Blue Alert status and continuously monitored the situations and submitted the Situational Report (SitRep) No. 6 and 7.

Medical Intervention

2. A total of **1,132 medical interventions (Tab A)** were reported. Of which, 832 suffered from cases of abrasions 180 patients, hypertension 132 patients, wounds (laceration, punctured, soft tissue injury, infected) 510 patients. Other cases are dizziness, high-blood pressure, medical trauma, abdominal pain, asthma, and headaches.

IV. PREPAREDNESS MEASURES

A. Regional DRRMC

1. Metro Manila

RDRRMC / Office of Civil Defense (OCD) - NCR

- a. In continuous coordination with concerned member-agencies and personnel re monitoring of the situation.
- b. Raised Blue Alert Status of the Operations Center to monitors the BNT 2018.

- c. Established Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and manned by the Metro Manila DRRMC in monitoring the situation during the entire duration of the festivity.

2. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) - NCR

- a. Prepositioned stockpile in RSCC and standby funds.
- b. Continuous monitoring of the BNT 2018 at the Field Office-NCR.

3. Department of Health (DOH) - NCR

- a. Raised Code White for all hospitals in Metro Manila
- b. Deployed 14 ambulance with medical team in 10 segments.
- c. [DOH-HEMB and DOH-NCR are on 24-hours monitoring](#)

4. Department of Information Communication Technology (DICT)

- a. Provided equipment to augment in Emergency Operations Center communication capability.

5. Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) - NCR

- a. Deployed water assets along Jones Bridge, McArthur, and Manila Ocean Park and two (2) SRR teams on standby.

6. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) - NCR

- a. Deployed 10 fire engine, 2 ambulances 1 Special Rescue Unit with a total of 202 personnel.

7. Joint Task Force (JTF) - NCR

- a. Prepositioned Emergency Responders at Strategic Areas in Quirino Grandstand and Quiapo Church.
- b. [Facilitate the request of the PNRI for the rotary aircraft for the conduct of aerial reconnaissance along BNT venue](#)

8. Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA)

- a. Deployed traffic personnel, communicators, and clearing and cleaning teams at all venues of the Black Nazarene Observation activities.
- b. Prepositioned Search, Rescue, and Retrieval Teams at the West Quadrant and near Jones Bridges.

9. National Capital Regional Police Office (NCRPO)

- a. Provided Peace and Order and Security Support to Manila Police District.

10. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) - NCR

- a. Installed concrete barriers in identified assembly areas.
- b. Inspected the safety of all bridges where the “andas” will passby.
- c. Placed on standby clearing teams, operators and equipment in strategic areas.

11. Local Government Units

CDRRMC Manila

- a. Leads the first level response in coordination with the MMDRRMC as indicated in the Manila DRRM Council Implementing Plan.
- b. Designated a Liaison Officer to be stationed at the Quiapo Parish Church Command Center.
- c. Established Incident command Post and staging areas with operating elements/responder groups within the vicinity.
- d. Deployed one (1) SRR team with equipment and vehicle.
- e. Deployed one (1) ambulance (BLS).
- f. Deployed one (1) Chemical, Biological, Radiological And Nuclear Decontamination Team with equipment.
- g. Deployed a total of 63 vehicles and 515 personnel.
- h. Manila Health Department provided ambulances with doctors and nurses, leads as medical clusters for mass casualty incidents
- i. Manila Fire District deployed fire engine and firefightings team
- j. Manila Police District lead the Law and Order Cluster, monitored the peace and order, anti-criminality. Deployed 1,861 police personnel for the 10 segments of procession.
- k. Manila Social Welfare Department assigned personnel at the designated evacuation center, prepositioned Food and Non-Food items, provide leadership in Camp Coordination and Camp Management
- l. Manila Public Works and Highways Department assigned heavy equipment with operators and provides logistical support
- m. DILG-Manila provides Management of the Dead and Missing

CDRRMCs Caloocan, Makati, Marikina, and Pasig

- a. Placed on standby response assets for any eventualities.

CDRRMCs Las Piñas, Quezon, and Taguig

- a. Placed on standby one (1) Task Force Team composed of one (1) Search Rescue and Retrieval (SRR) Team with vehicle and equipment and One (1) Ambulance with Emergency Medical Technician Team.

CDRRMC Malabon

- a. Placed on standby one (1) ambulance with Emergency Medical Technician Team and one (1) on-call personnel to serve as member of the MMDRRMC Incident Management Team.

CDRRMC Mandaluyong

- a. Placed on standby one (1) standby Ambulance with Emergency Medical Technician Team and two (2) on-call personnel to serve as member of the MMDRRMC Incident Management Team.

CDRRMC Muntinlupa

- a. Placed on standby two (2) standby Ambulances with Emergency Medical Technician Team.

CDRRMCs Navotas, San Juan and Valenzuela

- a. Placed on standby ambulance with emergency medical technicians.

CDRRMCs Parañaque and Pasay

- a. Placed on standby one (1) SRR Team with vehicle and equipment.

MDRRMC Pateros

- a. Placed on standby one (1) ambulance and emergency medical technician and one (1) SRR Team with equipment.

Quiapo Parish Church

- a. Host the celebration of the Feast of the Black Nazarene.
 - b. Established Quiapo Parish Church Command Center.
