I. INITIAL REPORT ON THE EFFECTS OF TAIL-END OF COLD FRONT IN BICOL REGION

A. Situation Overview

The Tail-End of Cold Front (TECF) brought heavy rains to the provinces of Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes in Bicol Region. The said weather system caused flooding and landslides in the region, which affected its populace.

B. Effects

1. Casualties

Four (4) fisherfolks were reported missing in Tinambac, Camarines Sur.

- Coordinated with PDRRMO Camarines Sur and CDRRMO Naga re: Status and Effects of the Heavy Rains

II. INITIAL REPORT ON THE EFFECTS OF NORTHEAST MONSOON IN APAYAO

A. Situation Overview

Heavy rains due to the surge of Northeast Monsoon caused flooding in Luna and Sta. Marcela in Apayao.

In view of this, Apayao Provincial DRRM Council raised its alert status to BLUE.

B. Effects

1. Affected Population

A total of 14 families or 36 individuals were affected by flooding Luna, Apayao.

2. Incidents Monitored

A total of two (2) flooding incidents were monitored in the province of Apayao.

C. Actions Taken

OCD CAR

- Close coordination with Apayao PDRRMO.
- Coordinated with with the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) in the region on weather status, road conditions, reported incidents (flooding, landslides, vehicular, etc.) and class suspensions.
- Advised all LDRRMCs Operations Centers and member agencies of the regional council to take proactive measures.

- Continuously sending weather advisories and alert status to all stakeholders thru all means of communication.
- Continuous sending of public advisories and warning alerts thru text blasts, social media accounts and in all available means of communication in partnership with PIA-CAR and local media outlets.

PDRRMC APAYAO

- Raised its alert status to BLUE effective 9:00 AM, 05 January 2018 for the continuous monitoring of the effects of the Northeast Monsoon in the province.
- Prepositioned rescue equipment and supplies.
- Alerted responders and volunteers for possible augmentation.
- Close coordination with the OCD-CAR.

MDRRMO LUNA

Provided relief goods to the affected population in Barangay San Gregorio.
