**02 August 2018 (4:00 AM)**

**SYNOPSIS:** Southwest Monsoon affecting the Western section of the country.

Metro Manila, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Palawan, Occidental Mindoro, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, and ARMM will experience cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon with possible flooding and landslides due to scattered rains or thunderstorms.

The rest of the country will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rains and thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon with possible flooding and landslides due to scattered rains or thunderstorms.
