SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TD "LUIS" has slowed down after making a landfall over Southern Taiwan.

TD "LUIS" is not expected to directly affect any part of the country. It may enhance the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) which will bring scattered moderate to heavy rains in llocos region, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Batanes and Babuyan Islands starting tomorrow (August 24). Residents in these areas, especially those living near river channels, in low-lying areas and in mountainous areas, are advised to take appropriate actions against possible flooding and landslides, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and to continue monitoring for updates.

Sea travel is risky in the seaboards of Northern and Central Luzon. At 8:00 PM today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated at 1,000 km East of Aparri, Cagayan (18.7°N, 131.1°E). This LPA may developed into a Tropical Depression within 24 to 48 hours.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "LUIS" was estimated based on all available data at 385 km North Northwest of Basco, Batanes (23.6 °N, 120.4 °E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 90 kph
Forecast Movement:	Moving West at 10kph
Forecast Positions:	 24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 540 km North Northwest of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.2°N, 120.9°E) 48 Hour (Saturday evening): 870 km Northwest of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (26.8°N, 117.0°E)
