I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TYPHOON "QUEENIE" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE NORTHWESTWARD.

- The typhoon is not expected to make landfall in any part of the country.
- The trough of TY "QUEENIE" will bring light to at times moderate rains over the eastern section of the country.
- Sea travel remains risky over the northern and eastern seaboards of Luzon due to rough to very rough seas associated with the Typhoon.
- It is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Friday morning (05 October).

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "QUEENIE" was located based on all available data at 1,000 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (19.2°N,131.0°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 200 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 245 km/h.
Movement:	Moving Northwest at 20 km/h.
Forecast Positions:	 24 Hour(Tomorrow evening): 695 km East of Basco, Batanes(21.4°N, 128.6°E) 48 Hour(Thursday evening): 605 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes(24.0°N, 126.4°E) 72 Hour(Friday evening): 915 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR)(28.2°N, 125.0°E) 96 Hour(Saturday evening): 1,475 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR)(33.1°N, 126.4°E) 96 Hour (Saturday morning): 1,120 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (30.2°N, 124.8°E)

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next update to be incorporated in the 4 AM Public Weather Forecast and in the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued
