#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "YUTU" has slightly weakened as it approaches the Philippine area of responsibility (PAR).

<b>Location of Center (10:00 AM today)</b>	The eye of Typhoon "YUTU" was located based on all available data at 1,955 km East of Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (16.9°N, 140.1°E)
<b>Maximum Sustained Winds</b>	180 km/h near the center
<b>Gustiness</b>	Up to 220 km/h
<b>Movement</b>	West Northwest at 20 km/h
<b>Forecast Positions and Intensities</b>	Tomorrow morning (27 October 2018): 1,470 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (17.6°N, 135°E)
	Sunday morning (28 October 2018): 900 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.8°N, 130.2°E) Typhoon
	Monday morning (29 October 2018): 560 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.3°N, 127°E) Typhoon
	Tuesday morning (30 October 2018): 255 km East East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.2°N, 124.1°E) Typhoon
	Wednesday morning (31 October 2018): In the vicinity of Cagayan (18.3°N, 121.5°E) Typhoon

TYPHOON "YUTU" is expected to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow morning (27 October) and will be named "ROSITA". The typhoon may threaten Northern Luzon and the eastern section of Central Luzon between Tuesday (30 October) and Wednesday (31 October). Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) may be raised as early as Monday morning (29 October) over Isabela and Cagayan area. Moderate to heavy rains directly associated with the Typhoon is expected over Northern and Central Luzon beginning Monday evening (29 October).

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to monitor for the next update on this weather disturbance to be incorporated in the Public Weather Forecast at 4 PM today and 4 AM tomorrow and in the next advisory at 11 AM Tomorrow.

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Tropical Cyclone Advisory No. 2** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

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
