TROPICAL DEPRESSION "SAMUEL" CONTINUES TO MOVE WEST-NORTHWESTWARD TOWARDS THE SAMAR-LEYTE-DINAGAT AREA.

- Moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flooding and landslides is expected over Visayas, **Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Siargao Islands**. Residents of these areas, especially those living near or in river channels, low-lying and mountainous areas, are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the areas under TCWS No. 1 and the eastern seaboard of Southern Luzon.
- "SAMUEL" is expected to make landfall over the **Samar-Leyte-Dinagat** area tonight.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "SAMUEL" was estimated based on all available data at 335 km East of Maasin City, Southern Leyte (10.2°N, 127.9°E) .			
Strength:	Maximum winds of up to 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h.			
Movement:	Moving West Northwest at 20 km/h.
