TROPICAL DEPRESSION "SAMUEL" IS NOW OVER THE VISAYAN SEA AND HEADING TOWARD ILOILO PROVINCE


- Moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flooding and landslides are expected over **Bicol Region, MIMAROPA and Quezon**. Residents of these areas, **especially those living near or in river channels, low-lying and mountainous areas**, are advised to take appropriate measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised **not to venture out** over the areas under TCWS No. 1, as well as the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon.
- **TCWS # 1 over Samar provinces are now lifted.**

Location of eye/center:	At 7:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "SAMUEL" was estimated based on all available data at 90 Km East Southeast of Roxas City, Capiz (11.3°N, 123.5°E) .
Strength:	Maximum winds of up to 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h .
Movement:	Moving West at 30 km/h .
