- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals may be raised over provinces in the eastern section of Visayas and Mindanao tomorrow morning.
- Moderate to heavy rains which may trigger flooding and landslides may prevail over Caraga Region, Davao Oriental, Compostela Valley, Southern Leyte, Bohol, Camiguin and Misamis Oriental beginning tomorrow. Residents of these areas, especially those living near or in river channels, low-lying and mountainous areas, are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Visayas and of Mindanao due to the approaching tropical cyclone.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "SAMUEL" was estimated based on all available data at 785 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del sur (6.5°N, 133.2°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h.
Movement:	Moving West at 20 km/h
