TROPICAL DEPRESSION "SAMUEL" HAS SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIED AS IT MOVES WESTWARD OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

- All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals have been lifted. However, fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are still advised not to venture out over the northern and western seaboard of Luzon
- "SAMUEL" is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tonight.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today , the center of Tropical Depression "SAMUEL" was estimated based on all available data at 240 km West Northwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (10.8 °N, 116.8 °E)
Strength:	Maximum winds of up to 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h .
Movement:	Moving West at 30 km/h .
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 705 km West of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) (10.8°N, 112.4°E)
