PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL DEPRESSION "SAMUEL" WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA IN THE VICINITY OF CALBIGA, SAMAR PROVINCE (11.6 N, 125.1 E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 45 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 80 KM/H. IT IS MOVING WEST NORTHWEST AT 25 KM/H. NORTHEAST MONSOON AFFECTING NORTHERN LUZON.

Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
