**STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS ARE EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:**

SEABOARDS	WEATHER	WIND FORCE (KPH / KNOTS)	SEA CONDITION	WAVE HEIGHT (meters)
THE NORTHERN AND EASTERN SEABOARDS OF NORTHERN LUZON (Batanes, Babuyan, Northern Coast of Cagayan and Northern Coast of Ilocos Norte)	Cloudy skies with rainshowers and isolated thunderstorms	45 – 63 / 24 – 34	Rough to Very Rough	2.8 – 4.5
