I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

01 January 2019

- At 4:00 AM, Northeast Monsoon affecting Luzon.
- Cagayan Valley, Aurora, and Quezon will experience cloudy skies with light to moderate rains caused by Northeast Monsoon. Possible flashfloods or landslides during moderate to at times heavy rains.
- Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, the rest of Central Luzon, and Bicol Region will experience cloudy skies with light rains caused by Northeast Monsoon. No significant impact.
- Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rains caused by Northeast Monsoon. No significant impact.
- Visayas and Mindanao will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers caused by localized thunderstorms. Possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

31 December 2018

- At 4:00 PM, Tail-End of a Cold front affecting Bicol region. Northeast Monsoon affecting the rest of Luzon.
- At 8:00 AM, the Low-Pressure Area (formerly "USMAN") was estimated based on all available data at 750 km West Southwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (7.0°N, 112.5°E), outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). This weather disturbance, together with the tail-end of a cold front, is no longer affecting any part of the country. Meanwhile, the Northeast Monsoon will continue to bring cloudy skies with light rains over the regions of Ilocos, Cordillera, Cagayan Valley, and Central Luzon.

30 December 2018

- At 3:00 AM, the Low-Pressure Area (formerly "USMAN") was estimated based on all available data at 240 km Northwest of Zamboanga City, Zamboanga del Sur (8.3°N, 120.4°E).

- At 10:00 AM today, the Low-Pressure Area (formerly Tropical Depression "USMAN") was estimated based on all available data at 340 km West Southwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (8.3°N, 116.0°E). This weather disturbance, along with the Tail-end of a Cold Front will continue to bring, in the next 24 hours, moderate to occasionally heavy rains over Bicol Region, Cagayan, Isabela, Aurora, Quezon, Mindoro Provinces, Marinduque, Romblon, and Northern Palawan including Calamian and Cuyo Groups of Islands. Meanwhile, light to moderate rains will prevail over Metro Manila, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) and the rest of Cagayan Valley Region, CALABARZON, Central Luzon, and Palawan.
- Due to the surge of the Northeast Monsoon, sea travel remains risky over the seaboard of Luzon and the Eastern seaboard of Visayas.

29 December 2018

- **Tropical Depression "USMAN" has made landfall in the vicinity of Borongan, Eastern Samar and has weakened into a Low-Pressure Area (LPA).**
- All Tropical Cyclone Warning Signals have been lifted.
- At 8:00 AM, the Low-Pressure Area (formerly TD "USMAN") was estimated, based on all available data, at 50 km West Northwest of Catbalogan City, Samar or 105 km East Southeast of Masbate City, Masbate (12.0°N, 124.5°E).
- At 4:00 AM, the center of Tropical Depression "USMAN" was estimated based on all available data at 65 km East Southeast of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.9 °N, 126.3 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It is moving west at 15 kph.
- TCWS No. 1 is raised over the provinces of Northern Palawan including Calamian Group of Islands, Southern Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate including Ticao and Burias Islands, Southern Occidental Mindoro, Southern Oriental Mindoro, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Northern Cebu including Camotes Islands, Aklan, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, Antique, Northern Negros Occidental, and Dinagat Islands.

28 December 2018

- Tropical Depression "USMAN" continued to move erratically over the Philippine Sea
- At 4:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression "USMAN" was estimated based on all available data at 285 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.7 °N, 128.3 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It is moving almost stationary.
- TCWS No. 1 is raised over the provinces of Northern Palawan including Calamian Group of Islands, Southern Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate including Ticao and Burias Islands, Southern Occidental Mindoro, Southern Oriental Mindoro, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, Samar, Biliran, Leyte, Southern Leyte, Northern Cebu including Camotes Islands, Aklan, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, Antique, Northern Negros Occidental, and Dinagat Islands.

27 December 2018

- Tropical Depression "USMAN" has further slowed down while moving generally westward.

- At 3:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression “USMAN” was estimated based on all available data at 420 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.4°N, 129.5°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It is moving West at 10 km/h. Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon.

26 December 2018

- Tropical Depression “USMAN” maintains its strength as it moves West-Northwestward.
- At 10:00 PM, the center of TD “USMAN” was estimated based on all available data at 565 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (10.6°N, 130.6°E).

25 December 2018

- The Low-Pressure Area (LPA) East of Mindanao has developed into a Tropical Depression has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).
- At 4:00 PM, the center of TD “USMAN” was estimated based on all available data at 945 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.4°N, 134.9°E).

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total of **238,127 families / 1,015,978 persons** were affected in **1,340 barangays** in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and VIII.
- Of which, **673 families / 2,859 persons** are being served inside **23 ECs** and **1,258 families / 5,349 persons outside ECs.**

B. CASUALTIES (TAB B)

- A total of **156 dead, 26 missing, and 105 injured persons** were reported in Regions MIMAROPA, V, and VIII.
- Of which, a total of **28 dead, 1 missing, and 42 injured persons are confirmed** while the rest are **still subject for validation / verification.**

C. Status of Lifelines

1. Roads and Bridges (TAB C)

- A total of **163 road sections and 5 bridges** in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, and VIII were reported affected by TD “USMAN”. Of which, **141 road sections and 2 bridges are already passable.**

2. Cancelled Flights

- **36 domestic flights** were cancelled due to bad weather condition since 27 December 2018.

3. Power Lines (TAB D)

- A total of **104 areas** in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and VIII have experienced **power interruption** since 29 December 2018. Of which, power supply in **89 cities/municipalities** were already restored.
- Further, a total of **23 diesel power plants and 3 mini grids** in Regions V, VI, and VIII were affected.

4. Seaports

- There are no more reported stranded passengers, vessels, and motorbancas since 31 December 2018. All fishing and shipping companies have already resumed their normal operations.

D. Flooded Areas (TAB E)

- A total of **223 areas** were reported flooded in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, and VIII. Of which, a total of **177 areas** have already subsided.

- A total of **36,574 houses were damaged (4,118 - totally damaged / 32,456 -partially damaged)** in Regions CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and VIII.

- Issued memoranda re conduct of PDRA and implementation of preparedness actions ICOW LPA East of Mindanao to Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, CARAGA, and NCR.
- Issued memoranda re Preparedness Actions for Residents in areas Susceptible to Landslide and Flooding to Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, ARMM, CAR, and NCR.
- Continuous monitoring and dissemination of Severe Weather Bulletins, Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warning, and other advisories to all RDRRMC/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- Conducted Press Briefing on 27 December 2018, 5:00 PM at the NDRRMOC Building, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City.
- Issued NDRRMC Advisory for LDRRMC to conduct/implement precautionary measures activities for the public to take appropriate actions and closely coordinate with local authorities for any public announcements and updates.

2. Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils

- **RDRRMC/OCDROs CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA** are on alert status to ensure the continuously and effective dissemination of weather advisories/ bulletins to RDRRMC member-agencies, P/C/MDRRMCs, and local media (radio stations) through OCD Short Messaging System, and upload the same to social media accounts to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero-casualty.

B. Pre-emptive Evacuation (TAB I)

- To date, a total of **6,479 families / 22,723 persons** were pre-emptively evacuated in **146 barangays** in the provinces of **Region VIII**.

IV. DISASTER RESPONSE (TAB J)

- The National Response Cluster was convened on 31 December 2018, 10:00 AM and 02 January 2019, 4:30 PM to further discuss the current response operations and immediate needs in the areas affected.
- Conducted Aerial Survey in affected areas in Region V on 31 December 2018.
- Emergency Telecommunications Cluster provided technical assistance to RDRRMC V.
- Facilitated and provided briefing re Preparedness and Response Actions on TD USMAN during the visit of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte in Camarines Sur Water Sports Complex, Pili, Camarines Sur

- A total of **₱149,492,878.24 worth of assistance** from OCD, DOH, DSWD, LGUs, and NGOs have been provided to Regions MIMAROPA, V, and VIII.
