PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) was estimated based on all available data at 135 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (9.8° N, 126.7° E). Meanwhile another LPA within the ITCZ was estimated at 185 km Northwest of Dipolog City (8.3°N, 121.7° E). Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern Luzon.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
