PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 PM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "HANNA" {LEKIMA} WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 845 KM EAST OF APARRI CAGAYAN (19.0N, 129.6E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 85 KPH AND GUSTINESS OF 105 KPH. IT IS MOVING NORTH NORTHWEST AT 10 KPH. SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING LUZON AND VISAYAS.
