### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

At **3:00 AM, 19 September 2019**, the center of Tropical Depression "NIMFA" was estimated based on all available data at **785** km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (**22.2°N, 129.3°E**) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h. It is moving northeast slowly. Southwest Monsoon affecting Central and Southern Luzon and Western Visayas.

Cruz, San Juan, and San Cristobal</li> <li>• <b>Batangas</b> - particularly Lian, Banabang-Molino, Pansipit, Kapumpang, Rosario-Lobo, and Upper Bolbok (Lawaya)</li> <li>• <b>Rizal</b> - particularly Upper Marikina and Kaliwa</li> <li>• <b>Quezon</b> – particularly Upper Umiray, Lower Bolbok (Lawaya), Malaking-Ilog, Iyam, Macalelon, Catanauan, Silongin Lagda, Pagsanjan, Yabahaan, Bigol, Guinhalinan, Vinas, Calauag, Pandanan, Sta. 	<p>Samagui, Bongabon, Baroc, Bulalacao, and Balete.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Marinduque</b> – particularly Tawiran – Tagum (Marinduque) and Boac.</li> <li>• <b>Palawan</b> - particularly Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langogan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton-Baton, Aramayawan, Ihawig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinlугan, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Culasian, Iwahig (Brookes), Okayan, Canipan and Busuanga, Coron.</li> </ul>
