#### PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 PM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL DEPRESSION "MARILYN" WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 1,265 KM EAST OF CASIGURAN, AURORA (18.0°N, 133.9°E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 55 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 70 KM/H. IT IS MOVING WEST°NORTHWEST AT 25 KM/H.
