At 3:00 PM today, Tropical Depression "JENNY" was estimated based on all available data at 320 km east of Infanta, Quezon (15.0°N, 124.6°E), with maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h. It is moving west northwest at 35 km/h. Southwest Monsoon affecting the western sections of Southern Luzon and Visayas.
