PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "LIWAYWAY" (LINGLING) was located based on all available data at 490^okm Northeast of Basco, Batanes (23.6°N, 125.3°E) with maximum sustained winds of 155 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 190 km/h. It is moving North at 10 km/h. **Southwest Monsoon affecting Northern Luzon.** Meanwhile, the low pressure area was estimated based on all available data at 940 km east Northeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (11.0°N, 134.5°E).

No. 06 for Region I (Ilocos Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasional moderate rains with thunderstorms.
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ilocos Sur - particularly Lower Abra, Silay-Sta. Maria and Buaya.• Ilocos Norte - particularly Bulu, Banban, Bacarra-Vintar, Laoag and Quiaoit.

No. 06 for Region III (Central Luzon)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasional moderate rains and thunderstorms.
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bataan - particularly Balanga and Morong.• Zambales - particularly Panatawan, Sto. Tomas, Bucau, Bancul and Lawis.


You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the Public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
