**PRESENT WEATHER:**

AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "INENG" (BAILU) WAS ESTIMATED AT 840 KM EAST OF CASIGURAN, AURORA (16.1° N, 130.0° E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 65 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 80 KM/H. IT IS MOVING WEST NORTHWEST AT 15 KM/H. SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING WESTERN SECTIONS OF LUZON AND VISAYAS.

<b>WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>CAMARINES NORTE</b> – particularly Labo and Daet Basud.</li><li>• <b>CATANDUANES</b> – particularly Cabuyan, Bato, and Pajo.</li><li>• <b>CAMARINES SUR</b> – particularly Lower Kilbay, Catabangan, Ragay, Tinalmud, Tambang, and Lagonoy.</li><li>• <b>ALBAY</b> – particularly Guinale and Upper Donsol.</li><li>• <b>MASBATE</b> – particularly Lanang, Mapayawan, Mandaong, Asid, Malbag, Guiom, Nainday, Daraga, Nauco (Aguada), and Baleno.</li><li>• <b>SORSOGON</b> – particularly Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banuang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan), and Matnog.</li></ul>
