### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) in east of Hinatuan, Surigao Del Sur has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "AMANG".

TD "AMANG" is expected to make landfall over Surigao del Norte mainland-Siargao Islands between afternoon and evening of January 20, 2019.

Possible raising of Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal #1 (TCWS #1) over Eastern Bohol and Southern Leyte in the next Severe Weather Bulletin.

The TD will bring moderate to heavy rains that will prevail over Caraga, Davao Oriental, Compostela Valley, Camiguin and Misamis Oriental beginning today (19 January). Moderate to heavy rains may prevail over Caraga, Northern Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, Central Visayas, Bicol Region, Southern Quezon, Marinduque and Romblon on 20 January. On Monday (21 January), Moderate to heavy rains may be experienced over Visayas, Bicol Region, Southern Quezon, Marinduque and Romblon.

Meanwhile, an LPA was estimated, based on all available data at 10:00PM today is located 580 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (7.3°N, 131.5°E) (inside PAR).
