1. Incident Report on the Grass Fire at Barangay Arado, Palo, Leyte

A. Situation Overview:

- On or about 01:40 PM 23 April 2019, a fire call was relayed by the Office of Provincial Fire Marshall (OPFM) Leyte Norte BFP to Palo Fire Station.
- Palo Fire Station deployed and mobilized Engine Coy #4 at 01:42 PM and arrived at around 01:45 PM, due to the severity of the situation Engine Coy #1 was called into action at approximately 01:48 PM to augment in the ongoing fire suppression.
- Due to the severity and magnitude of the fire incident, F/Insp Artemio N Salazar BFP as Ground Commander radioed OPFM Leyte Norte BFP and requested for additional augmentation of resource in support to the ongoing fire suppression.
- Second alarm was raised by the Ground Commander to expediently maximize the fire suppression operations in the ground with the assistance of other units.
- The following units from neighboring municipalities and city responded to the emergency:
 - 1. Sta Fe Station, Sta Fe, Leyte
 - 2. Alang-Alang Fire Station, Alang-Alang, Leyte
 - 3. Tacloban Central Fire Station, Tacloban City
 - 4. Tanauan Fire Station, Tanauan, Leyte
 - 5. Tolosa Fire Station, Tolosa, Leyte
 - 6. Filipino-Chinese Volunteer Fire Brigade (Green), Tacloban City
 - 7. MDRRMO, Palo, Levte
- Fire was declared under control at around 03:20 PM and subsequently declared fire out at 03:55 PM.
- Based on the initial investigation and inspection conducted at the fire scene, the involved area is an abandoned property owned by the Barber Family. The estimated area of the property / land was approximately 2-3 hectares wherein 90% to 95 % were burned.

B. Effects:

 No casualties or injuries were recorded from subject fire incident and no monetary value of the razed area is negligible due to no crops, livestock and structures were directly affected.

C. Actions Taken:

- The following fire stations responded in the fire incident: (1) Palo Fire Station, (2) Sta Fe Fire Station, (3) Alang-Alang Fire Station, (4) Tacloban Central Fire Station, (5) Tanauan Fire Station, (6) Tolosa Fire Station, (7) Filipino-Chinese Volunteer Fire Brigade (Green), and (8) Palo MDRRMO.
- Palo Fire Station conducted investigation re causes of fire incident.
- OCD RO VIII coordinated with BFP and MDRRMO Dulag re fire incident, and continuously monitoring the incident.
