**THE LOW PRESSURE AREA EAST OF VIRAC, CATANDUANES HAS DEVELOPED INTO A TROPICAL DEPRESSION AND WAS NAMED "HANNA"**

- "HANNA" is less likely to make landfall on any part of the country.
- **Tomorrow (04 August) and on Monday (05 August), moderate to heavy rains** will be experienced over Metro Manila, Zambales, Pangasinan, Bataan, Rizal, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro provinces, northern Palawan, Romblon, Aklan, and Antique. Meanwhile, **light to moderate to at times heavy rains** will be experienced over the rest of Luzon and Visayas.
- **On Tuesday (06 August), moderate to heavy rains** will prevail over Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Zambales, Pangasinan, Bataan, Rizal, Cavite, Batangas, Mindoro provinces, northern Palawan, Romblon, Aklan, and Antique. Meanwhile, **light to moderate to at times heavy rains** will be experienced over the rest of Luzon and Visayas.
- Residents in the aforementioned areas, **especially those living in areas identified to be at risk of flooding and landslides**, are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates, especially the **Thunderstorm Advisories** and **Heavy Rainfall Warnings** to be issued by PAGASA Regional Services Divisions.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised **not to venture out** over the western seaboard of Luzon

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	<b>At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "HANNA" was estimated based on all available data at 940 km East Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes or 1,190 km East of Infanta, Quezon (15.6 °N, 132.7 °E )</b>
<b>Strength:</b>	<b>Maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph</b>
<b>Movement:</b>	<b>Moving Northwest at 10 kph</b>
