A. Affected Population

A total of 1,726 families / 8,412 persons were affected in 25 barangays in Regions IX, XI, and XII. Of which, 1,137 families / 5,472 persons are being served inside 10 Evacuation Centers and 110 families / 545 persons are served outside ECs, broken down as follows:

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. NATIONAL DRRM COUNCIL (NDRRMC)

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Continuous monitoring and dissemination of Severe Weather Bulletins, Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warning, and other advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- b. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Core Group Meeting on 13 September 2019, 10:00 AM at the NDRRMC Conference Room, NDRRMC Building, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon, City.

B. REGIONAL DRRM COUNCILS (RDRRMCs)

RDRRMCs I, II, III, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, IX, XII, and CAR are continuously monitoring their areas of responsibility and are in coordination with their respective member agencies to ensure the widest dissemination of weather updates and advisories through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites.

- a. PNP personnel deployed at Taloc Elementary School to provide security at the evacuation center.
- b. Provided vehicles to transport evacuees back to their respective areas.
- c. Provided IEC on RDANA.
- d. City Social Services and Development Office (CSSDO) distributed mats (banig) and pillows to the evacuees and prepared food packs for distribution.

C. COST OF ASSITANCE

A total of ₱668,762.50 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families/persons; of which ₱614,762.50 was provided by DSWD and ₱54,000.00 from LGU to affected families in the Region IX and XII, as shown:
