### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

At 3:00 pm today, the center of Tropical Storm "ONYOK" was estimated based on all available data at 980 km east northeast of Baler, Aurora or 945 km east of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.3°N, 130.6°E) with maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 90 km/h. It is moving northwest at 35 km/h.

Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
